
In this time of unprecedented climate emergency California Climate Action can have a global impact

The Climate Emergency - it's all about the carbon



Buildings pollute - they contribute >40% of global carbon emissions




Time is short – we have only ten years

Goals: Mandatory Continuing Education in Zero Net Carbon Design

- Educate <u>all architects</u> in California about Zero Net Carbon design
- Prepare <u>all architects</u> to protect the public's health, safety & welfare
- Prepare <u>all architects</u> for rapidly changing energy codes
- Mobilize the profession to help lead statewide de-carbonization
- Focus first on reducing operational carbon, expand to resilience
- Ensure qualified instruction for all courses
- Collaborate with the California Architects Board (CAB)



Details:

- AIA CA proposes 5 additional LU's in Zero Net Energy Design to be required every two years for architecture licensure
- AIA CA will make courses available *free to all California architects*
- AIA CA will draw from an extensive network of experts to *ensure quality course providers*



Benefits to the Profession and the Public:

- Foundational expertise: Provides California architects with a basic understanding of the profession's role in reducing carbon
- Practice Support: Equips California architects with useful tools to prepare for future code cycles
- Free CE courses: AIA CA committed to providing free, qualifying education for these hours to members and other architects
- California leadership: Advances our state's national leadership in climate action and rapid de-carbonization
- Social Equity: De-carbonization will create new inner-city jobs and help protect disadvantaged populations from severe climate impacts



Resolution passed by the AIA California Board of Directors July 23:

Work with the California Architects Board to promote and obtain a requirement for architects to complete an additional 5 hours of continuing education in building decarbonization/Zero Net Carbon Design every two years as a condition of license renewal beginning with the 2023 renewal cycle.
