New Board Member Appointed



Fuad Sweiss was appointed by Governor Gavin Newsom in November 2023 as the newest public member on the board. His appointment brings the board to its full capacity of 10 members.

Sweiss' ambition as a young man attending the University of Jordan in Amman was to be an architect; however, his professor Talib Rifai (a world-renowned

architect and United Nations leader) had to approve his choice and steered him toward civil engineering instead. In 1981, he graduated with a degree in civil engineering and spent the next 40 years of his career working on infrastructure and public works projects, but his heart and affection always remained with architecture. Sweiss holds several licenses in California including professional engineer, professional land surveyor, and general engineering contractor, and is LEED AP certified by the U.S. Green Building Council.

Sweiss spent over 32 years in multiple government leadership positions, including executive director of public works for the City of Santa Ana, city engineer for the City and County of San Francisco as well as mayor's senior policy advisor on sea level rise and climate change, and engineering design manager for the City of Oakland's Public Works Department. He also served three consecutive terms as a state commissioner on the California Seismic Safety Commission.

He has extensive experience in the planning, design, and construction of major infrastructure and building projects for both private and public sectors. Some of the projects he

worked on are the San Francisco General Hospital, Central Subway, multiple branch libraries, fire stations, streetscape improvements, underground utilities, port facilities, and many others.

Sweiss gave lectures at prestigious universities such as Stanford, U.C. Berkeley, and Columbia University on the civil engineering profession, earthquake early warning systems, sea level rise, leadership, and other topics.

He is the founder and president of Global Modular Partners, a consulting engineering firm advising and helping developers, trade professionals, and modular factories to collaborate on the design and construction of modular buildings all over the world. His current projects span the globe: California, Guam, New York, Italy, Jordan, and Djibouti. He is proud to say these projects are creating jobs in underserved areas, utilizing sustainable materials and methods, and providing affordable housing to many people.

His favorite projects are his home that he designed and built 20 years ago and still lives in, as well as his office building that he also built and works in. When he is not traveling far and wide, he enjoys spending time with his family.

Sweiss is thrilled that his career as a civil engineer led him to the California Architects Board to be able to contribute to the profession of architecture, consumer protection, and to promoting modular and sustainability in architectural designs. He made sure to contact his professor in Jordan who was very happy to hear the news about his recent appointment!

New Regulations Affecting Your License

Zero Net Carbon Design Continuing Education—In 2021, Business and Professions Code (BPC) section 5600.5 was amended to add five hours of continuing education (CE) coursework on zero net carbon as a condition of license renewal. California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 166 is in the process of being created to establish qualifications for courses and course providers. The board received substantive comments during the initial comment period and modified

the language accordingly. There were no additional comments made after noticing the modified text, and the regulatory package has been submitted to the Office of Administrative Law for final review.

California Architects Board Raises Fees for Landscape Architects *First Time Since 2009*

The board has made the difficult decision to raise fees of the Landscape Architects Technical Committee (LATC) for the first time in 14 years because of increased operational costs. Beginning with landscape architect licenses that expire on after January 1, 2024, the new fees are required.

These new fees outlined in BPC section 5681 went into effect on January 1, 2024:

- Original license fee—\$700.
- License renewal fee—\$700.
- Duplicate license fee—\$300.
- Examination eligibility application fee—\$100.
- California Supplemental Examination fee—\$350.

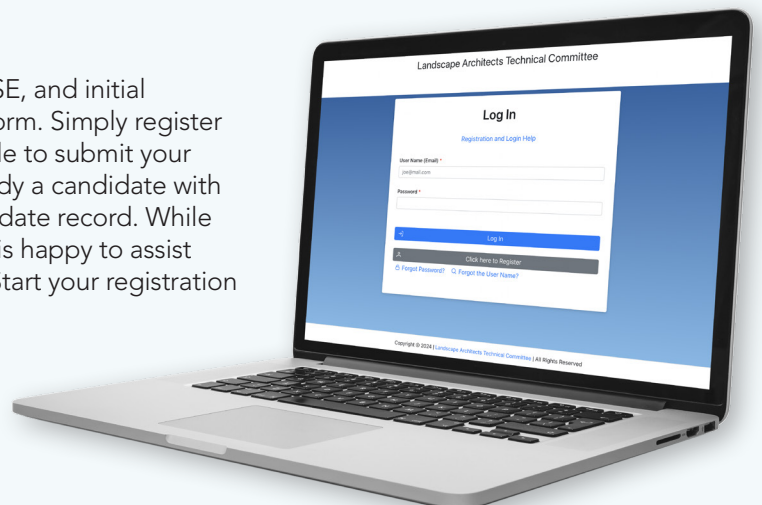
The Board and the LATC are self-funded by licensing fees and have been diligent to decrease operational and staffing expenses; however, costs imposed that are outside of our control have made it impossible to keep the budget



in balance. The main reasons for these fee increases are operational and staffing expenses, including costs related to LATC's business modernization efforts to update legacy IT platforms to a modern IT system. The LATC is currently in the process of transitioning to its new licensing and enforcement IT system (Connect). In May 2023, the LATC launched the new Connect system and began accepting online applications for Landscape Architect Registration Examination (LARE) Eligibility, the California Supplemental Examination (CSE), and initial licenses. The next Connect system release will include automation of the Certification of Experience and Reciprocity Applications, as well as online license renewal.

Retired Architect License

What does it mean to retire an architect license in California?

BPC section 5600.4 authorizes CAB to issue a retired architect license to an architect whose license is renewable and is not “suspended,” “revoked,” or otherwise punitively restricted. The titles “architect retired” or “retired architect” may be used by the retired license holder once the retired architect license is issued to them. It is unlawful to use either of these titles without first holding a retired architect license. The holder of a retired architect license may not offer architectural services to the public.

The purpose of the retired architect license is to provide an architect with a formal, permanent closure to their career. The retired architect license is not intended to be used as a temporary suspension of an architect license or as an “inactive” status. Under existing law there would be no benefits to using the retired architect license in this manner, as all accrued renewal fees and penalties would still be owed.

Many architects simply do not want an “Expired” license status displayed in our public license search (<https://search.dca.ca.gov>) because of the associated connotation that accompanies it. The retired architect license provides an alternative without any perceived stigma.

The **Application for Retired License** is presently available as a fillable printable form from our website and in the future will be available through our online application portal, Connect. The one-time application fee for a retired architect license is currently \$40.

Address of Record/Address Change/ Business Entity Report Forms

As a licensee, you are required to keep your mailing address up to date with CAB to ensure that you receive necessary information on renewals and other important matters relevant to your architect license. A licensee’s mailing address, commonly referred to as the “address of record,” is public information. The Board sends all correspondence to the licensee’s address of record, including notifications for license renewal, coursework audits, and complaints filed against the licensee.

Although this is a requirement for licensees per **CCR section 104**, candidates are encouraged to provide an updated mailing address as well. Candidates who provide CAB with an updated mailing address ensure they receive programmatic changes, updates to examination requirements, and applications for future testing.

Licensees are also required to file with the Board a **Business Entity Report Form** that specifies the proper and current name and address of each business entity through which they provide architectural services and immediately notify CAB of any changes to this information. Failure to comply with this requirement is a violation of BPC 5558 and title 16, **CCR section 104** and can result in a citation with an administrative fine of up to \$1,000 or disciplinary action by the Board.

Architect Obligation to Homeowner and Homeowner's Rights

Third-party contracts can be complicated, especially when the final consumer is the homeowner. This article discusses the rights of the homeowner, developer, and architect, and the obligations an architect has to a homeowner when the architect was not a party to the homeowner's contract with a developer.

This question arises when a developer hires an architect to design homes which the developer then builds and sells to consumers. In this situation, the architect's client is the developer, and the architect has a contract with the developer. The developer then has a separate contract with the homeowner. The architect is selling design services to the developer, and the developer is selling a finished home to the consumer.

The architect's client is the developer and the contract between these two parties must comply with **BPC section 5536.22**. The contractual agreement must be in writing, executed by both parties, and contain all the elements listed in BPC 5536.22(a). If the architect designs multiple homes with unique features, there must be a separate contract for each home.

The developer in this example is not a licensed architect, therefore the developer's contractual agreement with the homeowner cannot offer architectural services. The developer

cannot use the word architecture or anything similar in its contract or in its advertising. Use of such terms would require that the developer have a licensed architect as a partner, officer, or regular employee (as per CCR title 16, section 134(a) and (b)), and in that case, an architect would have to sign the contract with the homeowner (as per BPC 5536.1(a)). (See the Board's informational bulletin on **[Responsible Control in a Design-Build Firm](#)**).

The architect who designs the homes has responsible control over those designs and must sign and stamp the plans (BPC 5536.1(a)). Responsible control cannot be circumvented by contract, nor transferred to a third party who is not a supplanting architect (BPC 5535.1). There are only two limits on responsible control mentioned in the Architects Practice Act: An architect is not responsible for subsequent unauthorized changes to their plans (BPC 5536.25(a)), and the Board's enforcement action is subject to a 10-year statute of limitations (BPC 5561). Within those restrictions, an architect maintains responsibility for their designs even after the home is sold to a consumer.

If the homeowner discovers design defects in their home, the homeowner may initiate a lawsuit against the architect and file a complaint with the Board. The developer may be contractually responsible for some of the damages resulting from the architect's design defects, but the developer cannot take responsibility for professional misconduct reported to the Board.

Under the **[Architects Practice Act](#)**, architects are responsible for ensuring that their business practices comply with the laws regulating the profession, and that their designs and services meet the standard of care (CCR 160(b)(1)).



Enforcement Actions

March–May 2023

Citations

Juan Barrientos (Escondido)—The Board issued a one-count citation that included a \$1,500 administrative fine to Juan Barrientos, an unlicensed individual for alleged violations of Business and Professions Code (BPC) section 5536(a).

Barrientos was hired in September 2020 to provide “Architectural Drafting Services” to prepare plans and obtain a construction permit for a two-bedroom accessory dwelling unit in Vista, California. Barrientos has been paid \$3,800. Preliminary plans were submitted to the building department, but after more than two years the plans had not been approved and the application expired.

The Board sent Barrientos notice of the violation, but he failed to respond to any of Board requests for a response. Barrientos’ contract wherein he described his services as “Architectural” is a device that might indicate to the public that Barrientos is an architect or qualified to engage in the practice of architecture in California. Such conduct constitutes a violation of BPC code section 5536(a). The citation became final on June 10, 2023.

Maxwell Anthony Beaumont (Emeryville)—The Board issued a two-count citation, including an administrative fine in the amount of \$3,000 to Maxwell Anthony Beaumont, architect license number C-24621, dba Beaumont+Associates, for alleged violations of BPC sections 5584 and 5536.22(a), and California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections 150 and 160(c)(1).

Beaumont had been hired in June 2021 to prepare plans and obtain a construction permit for a new single-family residence located in Hayward, California. A contract for services was signed and executed on June 16, 2021 which included the term “Period of Performance: 12 weeks.” Beaumont was paid \$10,560, but the permit had not been issued after 37 weeks.

During this extended period, there was a significant lack of communication from Beaumont to his client regarding the basis for the delays and the permitting process. Beaumont violated Business and Professions Code section 5584, willful misconduct as defined in California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 150.

Beaumont also failed to respond in a timely manner to the Board’s request for information pertaining to this case. The Board sent an initial request on March 22, 2022, and a final request, via certified mail on May 3, 2022. Beaumont did not respond formally to the Board’s request until September 7, 2022. Beaumont’s failure to respond timely constituted a violation of California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections 160(c)(1).

Beaumont’s written contract failed to include a description of the procedure to accommodate additional services, a description of the procedure to terminate the contract, a statement identifying the ownership and use of instruments of services prepared by the architect, or a statement in at least 12-point type that reads, “Architects are licensed and regulated by the California Architects Board located at 2420 Del Paso Road, Suite 105, Sacramento, CA 95834.” Beaumont’s failure to include all of the required elements in his written contract for professional services for the above-referenced project constituted a violation of BPC section 5536.22(a).

In a separate project located in Fairfield, California, Beaumont agreed to prepare plans for the permitting of proposed commercial tenant improvements. Within the contract there was a term stating, “Period of Performance: 4 Weeks.” Beaumont was paid \$2,260.50, but the plans were never completed.

Beaumont stopped responding to his client’s phone calls and requests for updates. Because of the non-responsiveness of Beaumont, the client had to retain legal counsel to terminate the contract. Beaumont violated BPC section 5584, willful misconduct as defined in California Code of Regulations (CCR), title 16, section 150.

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Beaumont's written contract failed to include a description of the procedure to accommodate additional services, a description of the procedure to terminate the contract, a statement identifying the ownership and use of instruments of services prepared by the architect, or a statement in at least 12-point type that reads, "Architects are licensed and regulated by the California Architects Board located at 2420 Del Paso Road, Suite 105, Sacramento, CA 95834." Beaumont's failure to include all of the required elements in his written contract for professional services for the above-referenced project constituted a violation of BPC section 5536.22(a). The citation became final on September 3, 2023.

John Braly (Llano)—The Board issued a citation including a \$2,000 administrative fine to John Braly, an unlicensed person, dba Instructures Design and Build, for alleged violations of BPC 5536(a).

Braly was hired to prepare plans and obtain a construction permit for a residential remodel in San Pedro, California. He was paid over \$6,000 and refused to complete the plans for over seven months.

Braly's personal LinkedIn profile offered "Architecture" services. His company Thumbtack profile was categorized under "Architects" and offered architectural services. His company Yelp profile was categorized under "Architects" and stated, "We provide custom architectural design, engineering and construction plans." These online profiles wherein Braly described himself and his services as "Architects," "Architecture," and "Architectural," are devices that might indicate to the public that he was an architect or qualified to engage in the practice of architecture in California. Such conduct constitutes a violation of BPC section 5536(a).

Previously, on August 31, 2018, Braly had been issued a citation for similar violations of BPC section 5536(a) and was formally advised that an unlicensed individual or firm in California cannot use any term confusingly similar to the word architect or architectural to describe services offered or be labeled in such a category. The new citation became final on September 2, 2023.

Zeden Jones (Redwood City)—The Board issued a two-count citation, including a \$3,000 administrative fine, to Zeden Jones, former architect license number C-34705, for alleged violations of BPC 5584 and California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections 150 and 160(c)(1) (Willful Misconduct and Failure to Respond respectively).

The complaint alleged that Jones was hired on February 22, 2022, to perform architectural services under a contract worth \$6,000, with a retainer of \$2,000 paid upfront. After his license was revoked on April 17, 2022, he ceased communication with his clients, despite their attempts to establish contact with him. Jones's failure to comply with the terms of his architectural service contract and his failure to keep his client informed is a violation of BPC 5584 and 16 CCR 150 (Willful Misconduct).

The Board made multiple attempts to contact Jones, asking for a written response to the allegations and supporting documents. Jones did not respond to these requests, which constitutes a violation of 16 CCR 160(c)(1) (Failure to Respond). The citation became final on June 4, 2023.

Xin Miao (Irvine)—The Board issued a two-count citation that included a \$2,500 administrative fine to Xin Miao, an unlicensed individual, dba M and C Architecture, for alleged violations of BPC sections 5536(a) and 5536.1(c), and title 16, California Code of Regulations section 134(a).

In May 2020, Miao executed an "Agreement on Architectural Designs" under the business name: "M and C Architecture" and the title "Architect" to provide design services for a new hillside single-family dwelling and accessory dwelling unit in San Dimas, California for a fee of \$58,500. Miao was paid \$30,000. The project involved three distinct living levels in the house, which is not a building exempt from the licensing requirements of the Architects Practice Act. Such conduct constitutes a violation of BPC sections 5536(a) and 5536.1(c).

Miao's business name and contract, wherein Miao described his services as "Architecture" and "Architectural," are devices that might indicate to the public that Miao is an architect or qualified to engage in the practice of architecture in California. Such conduct constitutes violations of BPC section 5536(a) and title 16, CCR section 134(a). The citation became final on May 20, 2023.

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Seth Voiron (San Diego)—The Board issued a two-count citation that included a \$2,000 administrative fine to Seth Voiron, an unlicensed individual, dba Design Appurv, for alleged violations of BPC sections 5536(a) and 5536.1(c).

On April 9, 2021, Voiron contracted with a client to provide design services for a project that involved the conversion of steel shipping containers into studio apartments. Voiron received payment exceeding \$10,000 for the services provided but did not complete the project.

Voiron's offering and preparation of plans for shipping container apartments, which are not exempt from the licensing requirements of the Architects Practice Act, constituted a violation of BPC sections 5536(a) and 5536.1(c). The citation became final on June 4, 2023.

Justin Ware (Stockton)—The Board issued a two-count citation that included a \$750 administrative fine to Justin Ware, landscape architect license number LA 5033, for alleged violations of BPC section 5616 (Landscape Architecture Contract-Contents, Notice Requirements) and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 2670, subsection (b) (Rules of Professional Conduct – Standard of Care). The action alleged that Ware failed to include all requirements in the executed contract for a project and did not provide accurate and complete construction documents as agreed upon within the executed contract. Ware paid the fine, satisfying the citation. The citation became final on September 14, 2023.



Administrative Actions

Jacob Slater Bunting (Penryn)—Effective April 5, 2019, Jacob Slater Bunting's architect license number C-33928, was surrendered, and he thereby loses all rights and privileges of an architect in California. The action was a result of a Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, which was adopted by the Board.

An Accusation was filed against Bunting for alleged violations of Business and Professions Code (BPC) sections 5577 (Conviction of Certain Crimes) and 490 (Conviction of Crime).

The Accusation alleged that on or about May 25, 2016, in the criminal proceeding titled People vs. Jacob Slater Bunting, Slater was convicted by the Placer County Superior Court, on his plea of nolo contendere, of violating one count of Penal Code (PC) section 288.4(b) (meeting with minor for lewd and lascivious act), a felony, one count of PC section 288a(b)(1) (oral copulation of person under 18 years old), a felony, and two counts of PC section 261.5(c) (unlawful sexual intercourse with a minor), a felony, with an enhancement under PC section 12022.1(b) (secondary offense while released from custody on primary offense). On or about July 6, 2016, Bunting was sentenced to six years and four months in state prison and was ordered to register as a sex offender pursuant to PC section 290.

On or about February 5, 2019, Deputy Attorney General (DAG) Anahita S. Crawford submitted a Stipulated Surrender of License and Order to the Board for its consideration. The Stipulated Surrender of License and Order include terms and conditions that are consistent with the Board's Disciplinary Guidelines.

On March 6, 2019, the Board adopted the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, which became effective on April 5, 2019.

Bunting's license was reinstated on March 20, 2023. He was placed on probation for five years with specific terms and conditions. The action came after Bunting submitted a Petition for reinstatement and a Proposed Decision was adopted by the Board.
