Title 16, California Code of Regulations Division 2, California Board of Architectural Examiners Article 3, Examinations Section 116

SECTION 100. CHANGE WITHOUT REGULATORY EFFECT

Pursuant to Title 1, Division 1, Chapter 1, Article 2, Section 100(b)(3), of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), the California Architects Board (Board) hereby submits this written statement explaining why the proposed amendments to section 116 of Title 16 of the CCR do not materially alter any requirement, right, responsibility, condition, prescription, or other regulatory element of any CCR provision.

Subject to the approval of the Office of Administrative Law, the Board would add to, revise, or delete text in the CCR as follows:

Amend Section 116 of Title 16 of the CCR to:

Replace "Council" with "NCARB" in subsection (a)

The California Architects Board (Board) proposes to replace the word "Council" with "NCARB" from the above section to accurately refer to the name of the required record as utilized by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB). The record referred to using the new term, "NCARB Record," refers to the same record as the existing "Council Record" referred.

NCARB has updated the reference name for their candidate record to be plainly "NCARB Record". In regard to the Board there are no changes in the requirements between Council Record and NCARB Record. The Board simply verifies that the NCARB record exists and NCARB is a separate entity that provides and reviews the necessary requirements. It is not up to the Board to determine the contents of what an NCARB record is, it simply uses the nomenclature because that is what the national entity requires.
